## Deferred Maintenance Projects

### Need

Deferred Maintenance projects for BLM-Arizona address safety and security issues, restore previously used sites by removing old facilities, stabilize historic facilities, and provide resurfacing at parking areas. These projects will improve the overall condition of BLM facilities and help to reduce backlog maintenance.

### Recovery Act Funding

BLM-Arizona received \$817,000 through Recovery Act funding for 6 Deferred Maintenance Projects. The projects are located at critical mission communications sites, campgrounds, and recreation and administrative sites across Arizona. These projects will be primarily accomplished through construction contracts.



### Benefits

The Arizona public will be able to make better use of and enjoy properly maintained facilities.



### More Information

A typical deferred maintenance project would be repair or replace existing ramadas, relocate burro corrals, reconstruct campground pathways to meet Accessibility Standards for Outdoor Recreation Sites, or stabilize historic facilities for future generations. Other work would include repair or replace existing Off Highway Vehicle Barriers or Fencing.
