
Fire Mountain Mine Project

Need

The Fire Mountain Mine, located 40 miles north of Kingman off of the US 93, falls within the Bureau of Land Management's (BLM) Colorado River District. The mine's exposed shafts and adits pose a high risk to public safety at this time. This project will install access barriers and fencing to reduce public safety risks and to protect sensitive cultural resources and wildlife habitat. This project began in March 2010 with completion in June, 2010.


Recovery Act Funding

The BLM-Arizona competitively awarded a contract for the work to the Xcavation Company for \$4,480 as part of the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act (ARRA).



Benefits

The closure of dangerous shafts and adits will prevent entry by the public and mitigate public safety hazards. The fabrication and installation of bat gates and cupolas will also preserve the bat habitat in the abandoned mine workings.
