





Sky Islands and Desert Seas Restoration, Phase I: Oso Largo Erosion-Control Structure

Need

Phase I of the Bureau of Land Management's (BLM) Sky Islands and Desert Seas Restoration project includes repairs to three major erosion-control structures, one of them being Oso Largo. Currently, erosion is damaging the Gila Watershed and creating a hazard for public travel on existing roads. The major components of work include repairing the main and emergency spillway, repairing areas on the structure that are experiencing piping, stabilizing headcutting that is occurring around structure, repairing and stabilizing areas around the downstream side of the outlet pipes, clearing and grubbing the upstream side of structure, and creating an area to prevent water from pooling next to the structure. Work has commenced and should be completed in October 2010.



Recovery Act Funding

On April 27, 2010, the contract for completion of the project was awarded to CKC Construction in the amount of \$187,600.

Benefits

Repairs to this erosion-control structure are needed to minimize the possibility of a catastrophic dam failure that would result in increased sedimentation and major habitat and resource damage. Reducing the erosional problem will also help to stabilize road surfaces in the area and reduce maintenance costs.
