
Stateline Campground Project

Need

The Stateline Campground is co-managed by the Bureau of Land Management's (BLM) Arizona Strip Field Office and Grand Staircase-Escalante National Monument. The project site is on the Arizona-Utah border near the Vermilion Cliffs National Monument. This small campground is often at full capacity, providing overnight camping opportunities for visitors to the nearby Paria Canyon and the highly popular geological feature known as "the Wave." The recently designated Arizona National Scenic Trail is located next to the campground.

Recovery Act Funding

Mesquite, Inc. was awarded a \$180,000 contract to perform the work. Local equestrian and hiking group volunteers will also assist with installing the horse corral. Project construction began in late May and will be completed by the end of November, 2010.



Benefits

The campground has experienced a steady increase in the number of visitors, including equestrian user groups. Improving facilities with four additional camp spaces, picnic tables, fire rings, shade ramadas, a comfort station and a four stall horse corral will directly benefit the visitors' recreational experience and provide increased opportunities for exploring the national monuments and the Arizona National Scenic Trail. In addition, it will reduce overflow camping in the area and decrease associated resource impacts.
