



Accessibility Renovation at Five Recreation Sites

Need

Improvements to accessibility under the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) and the Architectural Barriers Act (ABA) have been accomplished at BLM sites throughout Idaho, but many lack connectivity between accessible features. This project will replace two comfort stations with accessible units and associated sidewalks at the Lower Silver Creek Recreation Site and at Lava Creek in the BLM Shoshone Field Office (south-central Idaho), and add accessible routes and camping features at four other sites: the Mica Bay Boater Park (seven miles from Coeur d'Alene, Idaho, by boat), the Skookumchuck Recreation Site (four miles south of Whitebird, Idaho), and the East Fork and Bayhorse Recreation Sites (19 miles and 10 miles southwest of Challis, Idaho, respectively).

Recovery Act Funding

The improvements will be accomplished through a variety of methods including construction contracts, GSA purchases, and in-house work.

Benefits

Work at these sites will enhance access for all public users and bring the sites into compliance with ADA/ABA code requirements.
