Need



Periodic assessments of conditions at BLM recreation sites in the Boise District (Idaho) have identified conditions at eight sites that need attention. Corrective maintenance work is needed to improve appearance, durability and safety, and to meet Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) accessibility standards.

Recovery Act Funding

Work will be completed between July 2009 and September 2010 by BLM seasonal employees and contractors.

Benefits

Facilities at the Cove Recreation Site (Four Rivers Field Office), Poison Creek Recreation Site (Bruneau Field Office), Jump Creek Recreation Site (Owyhee Field Office), Dedication Point Overlook and Initial Point (Four Rivers Field Office), the Bonneville Point Interpretive Site (Four Rivers Field Office), Steck Park (Four Rivers Field Office), and the North Fork Payette River Recreation Site (Four Rivers Field Office, south of McCall, Idaho) will improve the safety, durability and appearance of sites that are seeing increasing visitation and use, and broaden accessibility for visitors with disabilities.
