Rotarun Trail Construction

Need

An inventory of roads and trails on public lands in the Wood River Valley (south-central Idaho, near the town of Hailey) found that the only single-track trails there were user-created. Primarily used for mountain biking and motorcycle riding, most of these trails are not sustainable, cross private property, or conflict with livestock operations. In meeting with local trail groups, mountain bike shop owners, the Forest Service, and members of the community, the BLM also became aware of increasing demand for single-track trails in the area.



Recovery Act Funding

Funding for this project will pay for the construction of new trails.

Benefits

The Rotarun Trail network will accommodate increased demand and reduce conflicts among various users. The trail network will provide sustainable opportunities to be close to nature, enjoy unique outdoor scenery, and improved physical fitness and mental well-being. The trail network will receive an estimated 4,000 visits annually.
