
Idaho Falls District Roads and Parking Areas Sealcoating

Need

The BLM Idaho Falls District has 15 facilities with asphalt paving: five campgrounds, two trail heads and trails, three river access sites, four fire stations and an aerial fire retardant base ramp. Asphalt pavement should be seal coated at least once every 10 years; otherwise, it deteriorates to the point that total removal and replacement are needed.

Recovery Act Funding

The District will contract for most of the seal coating through full and open contracts. The sites and roadways are located throughout eastern Idaho.



Benefits

Proper maintenance of recreation sites and parking areas helps ensure a positive experience for recreational visitors, who increasingly expect developed amenities at BLM recreation sites. Maintenance of stations and retardant bases contributes to firefighter and fire equipment safety. This district-wide investment will help eliminate a significant future maintenance and reconstruction costs.
