## Shoshone Field Office HVAC and Roof Replacement

### Need

Original systems installed 30 years ago when the Shoshone Field Office buildings, located at 400 West F Street in Shoshone (south-central Idaho), were constructed are at the end of their physical life. They are not very energy efficient, and difficulty regulating temperature and ventilation is resulting in comfort and health issues. The roof on the Shoshone building is also almost 30 years old with considerable leaks that spot repairs no longer prevent. Wet insulation and ceiling panels create concerns over mold growth.



### Recovery Act Funding

The project will upgrade the heating-ventilation-air conditioning (HVAC) systems and replace the roof.

### Benefits

The project will reduce energy consumption and eliminate comfort and health concerns for visitors and BLM employees. The project will incorporate sustainable features and energy efficient systems, substantially reducing annual maintenance and operating expenses for the field office/district and the government. Spending less on energy and repairs will have the added benefit of preserving natural resources and reducing pollution.
