



Wilderness Study Areas Route Inventory and Resource Assessment

Need


The Bruneau-Jarbidge Rivers Wilderness was recently designated in the Omnibus Public Lands Management Act of 2009 and is now part of the BLM National Landscape Conservation System (NLCS). This project will inventory 192,000 acres of public lands in the Wilderness and the Lower Salmon Falls Creek Wilderness Study Area (WSA). The desert canyons offer areas of natural solitude and prehistoric cultural sites.

Recovery Act Funding

Over a three-month period, BLM field personnel will document vegetation, travel routes, various cultural and scientific resources in the areas, and current human uses and impacts.

Benefits

The results of the inventory will help the BLM ascertain current conditions in the Wilderness and WSA and identify which lands may need further work to restore wilderness characteristics such as solitude, naturalness, and opportunities for non-mechanized recreation.
