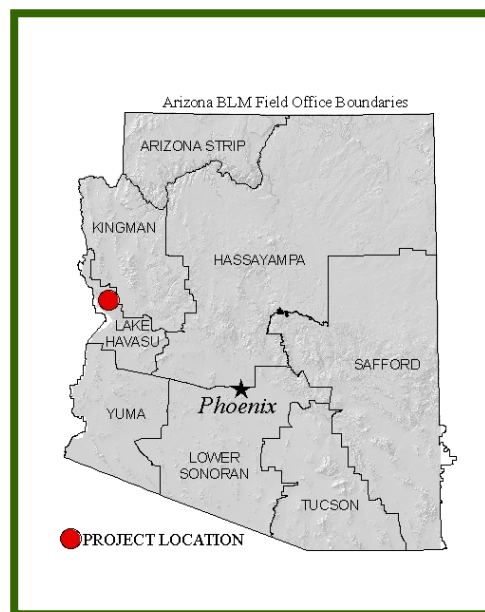
Crossman Peak Communications Site Safety Repairs

Need

The Bureau of Land Management's (BLM) Arizona State Office manages the Southwest U.S. Border State Radio Communications Site at Crossman. This location of the site is remote and accessed by a steep, winding, natural surface road in mountainous terrain. The Crossman Peak Communications Site Safety Repairs project will replace the existing radio equipment shelter and solar power system with a new shelter that will have the solar power system pre-installed. The project will also provide a new radio communications tower and replace the electrical and grounding systems for the site and shelter.

The initial construction schedule estimate begins June, 2010 and ends November, 2010. Though specific areas of the site may be restricted during construction, the site will be accessible throughout construction. There are expected

to be some radio service interruptions during repairs to the electrical and grounding systems..

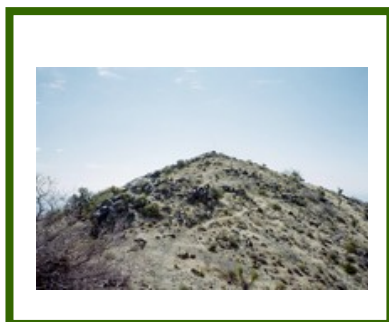


Recovery Act Funding

Benefits

The Crossman Peak Communications Site provides radio coverage required for law enforcement, initial-attack fire, and emergency first-aid and enables logistics for daily coordination of field personnel. This project promotes the use of a renewable energy source at a federal administrative site and addresses health and safety compliance.
