Tishomingo National Fish Hatchery American Recovery and Reinvestment Act FACT SHEET

Project Description

The U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service (Service) will utilize \$258,000* in Recovery Act Funds for four projects at Tishomingo National Fish Hatchery (NFH) in Johnston County, Oklahoma.



Tishomingo NFH, located in southern Oklahoma, will be the recipient of \$258,000 in Recovery Act Funds.

The first project will combine two ponds (2E and 3E), which seep due to old age and are too small for use. The new larger pond will be approximately a quarter of an acre in size.

The second project will install two geo-membrane liners at the bottom of the newly formed pond and in pond 1F, which is also currently seeping badly.

The third project will rehabilitate the feed storage building at the hatchery. The fourth and final project will make the Tishomingo administrative building more energy efficient by replacing light bulbs; increasing insulation; installing programmable thermostats; caulking, sealing and weatherstripping leaks; and replacing windows and appliances.

Project Benefits

These four Recovery Act projects will increase Tishomingo’s capacity and help it meet its production goals, provide better efficiency for fish cultivation and help the Service save money wasted on energy inefficiency, freeing funds to be used elsewhere.


