### Mora Fish Hatchery to do Energy Efficiency Upgrade American Recovery and Reinvestment Act FACT SHEET

#### Project Description

The U.S Fish and Wildlife Service (Service) is accepting bids on a project to increase energy efficiency at Mora National Fish Hatchery and Technology Center (NFH&TC). The Recovery Act funded project calls for the installation of ten energy efficient doors at four buildings on the Mora, New Mex. Property.

The energy efficiency project is part of a larger facilities upgrade at Mora NFH&TC, and at Service facilities nationwide. Other projects being undertaken at Mora NFH&TC include air-conditioner installation, roof repair, water purification upgrade, and safety and cosmetic enhancements.

One of seven federal fish hatchery technology centers in the U.S., Mora NFH&TC was established in 1997 with a mission of protecting and rearing imperiled southwestern fish. The Service expects completion of all Mora projects by late 2010.

#### Project Benefits

The Service expects the installation of energy efficient doors to create work and to reduce energy usage.
